In 2010, she was appointed the UK government's Digital Champion, tasked with ensuring the population's access to and understanding of the internet. This initiative led to the establishment of the charity, Go ON UK, aimed at improving digital skills across the nation. Martha has held non-executive director roles at several major companies, including Marks & Spencer and Twitter, and has been a key figure in shaping digital strategy and ethics.
