Sean was awarded the New Zealand Order of Merit by the Governor General in 1997 and 2 years later he was appointed as 'Rugby Consultant' to the NZRFU responsible for player development and liaison. Since May 2000 he is Chairman of the Laureus World Sports Academy and a respected rugby analyst for TV and newspapers.
